Finally, we recognise the need to examine our organisation inwardly as we revisit and refine our systems and infrastructure to ensure staff and volunteers are supported and well-resourced to carry out the mahi we are part of.

Prioritising Kaupapa Māori within

We are committed to the continued development of the Whānau Centre and services to support Māori to enable the achievement of hauora outcomes for whānau Māori.

Our focus will be on activities that lead to:

- The building of Kaupapa Māori support for whānau and staff through expert Māori leadership and the implementation of our Kaupapa Māori framework.
- The development of strong external Māori partnerships with local mana whenua and Māori organisations in urban and rural Aotearoa New Zealand.
- A building of relationships that lead to a collaboration with faith-based organisations to support growth in their Kaupapa Māori foundations and service delivery.
- Establishing a Kaupapa Māori learning hub to support the growth of Kaupapa Māori within mainstream NGOs.

We are committed to the provision of communitybased supportive housing throughout our communities, coupled with the provision of wraparound supports.

Our focus will be on activities that lead to:

- Continuing the Housing First programme in Auckland and other areas of need, working collectively to end homelessness.
- Increasing the supply of quality social housing, both through Visionwest housing developments and within the community housing sector.
- Collaborating with partners to address youth homelessness with innovative solutions.
- Using a Kaupapa Māori model of care to increase our capability in addressing complex issues faced by the whānau we house.
- Providing transitional housing while there is a shortage of permanent housing solutions.

We are committed to the continuing development of our wraparound service approach to meet the needs of whānau.

Our focus will be on activities that lead to:

- Building financial and food independence enabling whānau to flourish.
- Building self-reliance and reducing isolation in our community.
- Nurturing and supporting tamariki, rangatahi, and adults in educational and employment aspirations.
- Delivering empathetic clinical and pastoral support for whānau facing trauma and hardship, including Kaupapa Māori-based trauma care.
- Ensuring shelter and accommodation for whānau trapped by homelessness.



Establishing partnerships with likeminded organisations with a view to collaborating to bring about social change in communities throughout Aotearoa New Zealand.

We recognise that no organisation can walk the journey of community transformation alone, and so we are committed to collaborating with others in our efforts to see transformed lives and healthy communities.

Our focus will be on activities that lead to:

- Working collectively with partner organisations and individuals to effect systemic change into social issues affecting New Zealand communities.
- Demonstrating a consistently maturing Kaupapa Māori model underpinning all aspects of organisational and whānau transformation.
- Collaborating with Government agencies, corporate entities, Glen Eden Baptist Church and other faith-led community groups to respond to, and act on, the most pressing social issues facing our communities.



Providing the trust with appropriate resources to ensure effective service delivery and to develop work environments that promote staff wellbeing.

We are committed to building robust systems and an infrastructure that enables Visionwest to deliver support to whānau in a timely and effective manner.

Our focus will be on activities that lead to:

- Fostering positive staff wellbeing through environments and initiatives within the faithled, Kaupapa Māori values that uphold our organisation.
- Increased professional development for our staff, resourcing them with the skills needed to better carry out the projects, programmes and initiatives critical to their roles while supporting their resilience and wellbeing.
- Developing digital competencies and infrastructure that enables better data analysis, service provision and decision-making.
- Provision of physical work environments that are fit for purpose and healthy, positive places to work.
